The inefficiencies in some areas have resulted in a lack of proper support where it matters most.

What are your plans to address the challenges around class complexity in your school division?

Classroom complexity is a major issue for our school division. The obvious need is to have smaller classes and more EAs or other classroom help. Teachers work very hard to teach in different ways to kids with varying needs. Having smaller groups would help reduce some of the additional strain. EAs can also be a great deal of help in the class to help with those who need more supports. The same way that not every kid fits the same mold not every school division, not every school and not every classroom would need the same solution for complexity.

The division need to recognize that each school may have different needs and work with those schools for solutions. Where one school may have enough physical space that an additional class can be added to reduce class size another school may be at full capacity and not have that ability. They instead may require additional classroom supports with EAs in order to help ensure everyone is getting the education they deserve. You may have one classroom within a school that has a small size and yet is still very complex if they have several students who need additional support and only benefit from additional staffing (teachers or EAs). Each school should have the autonomy to address their individual needs.

Teachers, administrators and EAs should be given more time for prep as well. With having a great deal of complexity it makes lesson planning more complicated. For teachers to have a fair shot at doing this they need more time to plan as well as the capacity to increase their education on the needs for their students. Continuing education, in a world where there are some many different intellectual, physical, emotional and behavioral needs, is key and for many teachers this is being done on their own time.

How will you ensure teachers in your school division have the resources they need to support students in the classroom?

Working to have open dialogue and conversations between the school board, the schools, the teachers, the SCCs and the ministry to address where the funding is needed. Working to have specific asks back for the funding and where it is needed with why. The need for additional resources will never be something that ends and continued advocating for that to the ministry and through MLAs will be a constant. I have seen a lot of slow moving changes over time and I think it is time to stop the slow creep of oversized classes, overworked teachers and kids who are suffering with poor mental health and falling behind academically. IT is time for change.

Some of these questions are vague and difficult to answer The question about supporting diversity initiatives requires a bit more of a deep dive. I firmly believe that ALL people- every single person- has the right to feel safe to be themselves. However, I think the initiatives should be about treating each other well regardless of any difference you may notice instead of a focus on all the the different types of differences particularly in the younger grades.

Psychological safety for everyone is important. This leads into drawing attention to the growing issue of bullying in schools and while there are policies in place those policies need to be enforced in a stronger way.

It is also important for teachers to be protected in the classroom. Violence in the classroom and violence from parents has become too much of a reality. Teachers are the integral part of the education system and having them safe (physically and mentally) is important for not only retention but overall job satisfaction. When we are asking teachers to try and do so much with so little the least we can do is keep them safe.

Selecting three top priorities was difficult as in order to address class complexity we need to be looking at increasing budgets, classroom resources and specialist supports. In doing so we would be addressing teacher wellness, student mental health, classroom violence and teacher recruitment.

It's about students with different learning abilities, different language barriers, different challenges, different behaviors and different backgrounds. The current situation has teachers doing the work of Educational Psychologists, Speech and Language Therapists, and Occupational Therapists without actually being one. This is unfair to both students and teachers.

As parent of children with complex needs, I see there is a need for adequate and equitable funding for our schools. I strongly believe that early intervention is critical to addressing classroom complexity. Unfortunately, there is a very limited number of Educational Psychologists, Speech and Language Therapists, Occupational Therapists available within Prairie Spirit. Some children wait years to be evaluated and have missed out on that early intervention and therapies that are needed.

Another way to mitigate the challenges of classroom complexity is to bring Educational Assistants back to class. These EA's are an integral part of our student's education experience. Not only do they support students who need them, but they support teachers by freeing them up to assist other students.
