2025 Constitution Amendments Summary

The PSTA has completed a full review of its Constitution, last updated in 2023, with guidance from the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation (STF). The 2025 Draft ensures alignment with STF bylaws, strengthens governance, and adds a focus on teacher wellness. Members will vote on three grouped motions at the August 2025 General Assembly.

Motion 1: Minor Language and Structural Edits

- Updates wording for clarity and consistency (e.g., "school staff representatives" instead of "liaisons").
- Affirms substitute teachers have full membership rights.
- Removes redundant clauses (associate membership now covered by STF bylaws).
- Merges "Affiliation" into "Name" for clarity.
- Combines budget and fee approvals into one vote.
- Standardizes formatting, numbering, and terminology.

Effect: No change in meaning or member rights; purely housekeeping.

Motion 2: Addition of the Teacher Wellness Committee

- Establishes Teacher Wellness as a **standing committee** (three members, elected annually by the Representative Assembly).
- Committee represents PSTA members on the Wellness Committee established under Section 13 of the LINC agreement.
- Focus: teacher wellness initiatives and member supports.
- Chair joins the PSTA Executive to ensure wellness is part of decision-making.

Effect: Acknowledges wellness as a dedicated priority while complementing existing supports.

Motion 3: Other Significant/Substantive Changes

- **STF Alignment:** PSTA must act in solidarity with STF, seek STF approval before lobbying governments, and follow STF guidance in local bargaining.
- Representative Assembly (RA): Quorum introduced (more than 50% present). RA
 explicitly empowered to adopt PSTA policies. RA now elects all Executive and
 committee members except the President.

- **Executive Structure:** Lists all Executive roles, adds Wellness Chair, clarifies Past President role.
- LINC Terms: Members serve staggered two-year terms (half elected each year).
- Offices & Duties: Formalizes responsibilities of all officers and committees in the Constitution (previously only in policy).
- Officer Removal: New due-process framework:
 - Requires notice and an 80% Executive vote before proceeding.
 - Removal must then be ratified by the RA (for officers) or General Assembly (for President).
 - o Protects fairness and ensures accountability.
- **Committees:** Removes inactive committees (Partnership Advisory, Superannuation Recognition, Social) while standardizing duties of active ones.

Effect: Strengthens transparency, accountability, and stability.

Summary

The proposed amendments modernize the PSTA Constitution, address STF requirements, and improve governance. Together, these motions create a clearer, more accountable, and wellness-focused framework.
